- 2. Acknowledge and reaffirm that the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Port of Spain Declaration in 2007 was crucial to catalyse the first High-Level Meeting of the United Nations General Assembly on NCDs in 2011 and recognize that SIDS continue to demonstrate global leadership in promoting awareness and actions to address the NCD and mental health epidemic and the climate crisis, as exemplified by the Pacific Islands NCD Roadmap, the SIDS Accelerated Modalities of Action (SAMOA Pathway), the Barbados Declaration on Achieving Sustainable Energy for All in SIDS and the Bridgetown Initiative.
- 3. Remain deeply concerned that premature mortality from the NCDs, the challenges to the livelihood and wellbeing of people living with NCDs and mental health conditions, coupled with the escalating climate crisis, represent an existential threat to health and development in SIDS.

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Highlights of 2023: NCD prevention

Positively influenced the <u>update of the WHO Global NCD Action</u>

Plan's Appendix 3 (a.k.a. NCD 'best buys' and other recommended interventions), with a WHA side event on the prevention 'best buys' and its expansion (May 2023)

 Started implementing our advocacy on marketing and labelling policies across NCD risk factors – <u>Selling a Sick Future</u> and <u>Warning</u> against Harm publications (October 2023)






Highlights of 2023: NCD financing

Looking towards 2024 and 2025



4th High Level Meeting 2025

"The fourth high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases in 2025 will be a **time to reflect on the tragic premature death toll** from NCDs of 15 million people each year since 2015 – and which is projected to reach a total of more than 150 million over the previous decade by 2025.


It will also provide an **opportunity to adopt a new, ambitious and achievable political declaration** on NCDs based on evidence and grounded in human rights that will serve as an **important framework to accelerate the global NCD response from 2025, including achieving the SDGs before 2030**, *and place countries on a sustainable path into the next decades.* "

UNSG Report 2024: what we know so far

- Mandated by para 50 of HLM3 Political Declaration for delivery by end of 2024
- WHO DG to prepare 2024 Progress Report on behalf of UNSG, in consultation with Member States
- Regional Consultations to take place June-September 2024...but EURO as early as April 2024
- 2024 Report format will be similar to the format used for the four previous report:
 - Chapter 1: Introduction
 - Chapter 2: Progress towards internationally-agreed targets: Where do we stand? (advances and challenges)
 - Chapter 3: Progress made in fulfilling the assignments given to WHO
 - Chapter 4: Progress made in fulfilling the commitments made by Member States
 - Chapter 5: Progress made in strengthening international cooperation
 - Chapter 6: Recommendations for consideration by Member States during the negotiations on the 2025 political declaration on NCDs
 - Annex: Individual county data on the 10 progress indicators set out in the technical note published by WHO on 1 May 2017.



HLM4 Political Declaration

- Will be informed by
 - UNSG Report 2024 recommendations
 - An initial decision reviewed by EB156 in January 2025
 - A decision taken at WHA78 in May 2025
 - A multi-stake-holder hearing in Q2 2025 (likely)
- A zero draft is likely to be produced around WHA78 (likely soon after)
- Final draft negotiated May-August 2025



Modalities Resolution

- Negotiated by Member States under auspices of two co-facilitators appointed by President of the UNGA
- To be adopted at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) covering:
 - \circ Scope
 - \circ Modalities
 - Format
 - Organization
 - Date
- Same two co-facilitators will lead the negotiation of the HLM4 political declaration
- Timing not clear likely Q4 2024 but could be even later



HLM4: Main Steps for Policy Development

Main steps

- Initial membership survey on priorities for HLM4 Q1 2024
- Consultation webinars (via PLAN on an Inclusive Agenda) with membership Q1 2024
- Prioritisation survey Q1 2024
- Consult with NCDA Board Policy & Programme Committee
- "Soft launch" of priorities at WHA77 Geneva in May 2024
- Campaign launch at Global Forum, Kigali in October 2024

- NCDA narrative and briefings on global progress against targets
- Policy development:
 - NCD targets beyond 2025 and 2030
 - Accountability mechanisms

- WHO Global Conference on Air Pollution and Health (Accra, 28 October-1 November 2024)


