





# WHO process – GVA permanent missions




# **UN process – NYC permanent missions**











# International Financing Dialogue for Sustainable Financing of NCDs and MH

- Technical meeting but brought in a lot of great national examples
  - Philippines, Egypt, Indonesia, Moldova
- Very focused on Domestic Resource Mobilization limited discussion of other financing mechanisms
- WB seemed to really treat this as a learning exercise to help them further their strategy and plans
- HLM woven into the meeting more than agenda led us to believe, but we did not leave with anything to "get behind" in terms of direction for financing priorities, so
- Advocacy opportunities: Increasing sustainable funding for health that includes specific and measurable financing targets for NCDs; Improving the monitoring, transparency, and accountability for financial flows; and; leveraging the "win-win" that excise taxes and other fiscal measures provide for health
- Official meeting summary and outcome document coming in September



### Pact of the Future – What it does for health

- Agreeing to promote UHC as a means to eradicate poverty and reduce inequality
- Acknowledging a healthy planet supports the health and well-being of current and future
  generations and take "ambitious" action against various forms of pollution (including water and
  air) and address the impact of climate change, particularly environmental challenges that impact
  the right to a clean and healthy environment
- Agreeing to ensure tech and innovation contribute to reducing inequalities and improving health
- Investing in and ensuring equitable access for young people to health and other social services
  and accelerate action to ensure young people enjoy the highest attainable standard of physical
  and mental health, access to UHC, and SRHR
- Promoting sustainable food systems
- Requesting that the SG develop a framework/set of indicators that goes beyond GDP to measure sustainable development



### Pact of the Future – What it doesn't do

- Reaffirm women and girls' full SRHR (it is mentioned in a PP style para but is not included in an OP style para)
- "High attainable standard of health" leaves governments wiggle room in terms of what is "possible" within their contexts which is a loophole to get out of offering sexual and reproductive health services as well as gender-responsive and transformative healthcare
- Affirming the right to health in humanitarian settings (among other services like education)
- Explicitly link nutritious food to health
- Addressing industry influence and COI in global governance




