## ENOUGH. Making 2018 the year for action and impact on NCDs.

Against the backdrop of the 71st World Health Assembly in Geneva and during a pivotal year for the global NCD response, this side event seeks to "set the bar high" for the 2018 UN High-Level Meeting on NCDs (UN HLM) and beyond.
