# Global NCD Framework WHA follow-up

WHA NCD Resolution requested WHO Director-General to:

1. Develop **terms of reference for a Global Coordination Mechanism(GCM)** by November 2013
2. Develop a limited set of **“action plan” indicators** in 2013
3. Conclude work on **division of tasks and responsibilities for UN organisations** before end of October 2013

*All 3 WHO consultations to be finalised during  
WHO Formal Member State Meetings in Geneva,  
11-15 November*

## WHO GCM Meeting, 11-13 November Overview

### GCM ToRs not complete!

- Co-chaired by **Brazil and South Africa**
- Introduced as a ***“first reading”*** of the GCM
- Meeting overran to **3 days** (rather than 2)
- Agreed on **some** sections of the ToRs....others remain unresolved
- Agreed to **follow-up Member State meeting** to conclude the work (between Jan-May 2014)
- Still aiming to have GCM **finalised and adopted at WHA 2014**



## WHO GCM Meeting Outcomes

### Agreed sections:

- **Purpose/scope:** *facilitating* and enhancing *coordination*...to contribute to implementation of GAP
- **Functions:** advocacy; knowledge exchange; innovation; multisectoral action; financing
- **Participants:** led by Member States; UN, IGOs and NSAs *participants*
- **Name:** “GCM-NCD”
- **Lifespan:** 2014-2021

- NSA engagement
- Working groups
- Governance

## GCM Next Steps

- Member State meeting to conclude work (EB-WHA)
- Adoption at WHA 2014

### **NCD Alliance priorities/approaches.**

- Robust governance structure that is *fit for purpose*
- Approaches: informal briefings with GVA missions; advocacy at WHO EB; advocacy in capitals by our network.

# UN Interagency Task Force on NCDs Mandate and Rationale

- Formally established at **ECOSOC 2013** – expands mandate of UN TF on Tobacco Control
- ECOSOC resolution requested development of **ToRs and division of tasks and responsibilities...** for adoption at ECOSOC's 2014 Substantive Session

## Opportunity to leverage a UN system-wide response to NCDs:

- “Deliver as one”
- Political mandate for new actors + initiatives

- **Accountability:** Reporting to ECOSOC; biennial reporting on DoTRs to ECOSOC and WHA.
- **Links to GCM:** TF members participate in GCM
- **Division of tasks and responsibilities:** Organised around GAP objectives / 27 work areas; convening and partner orgs

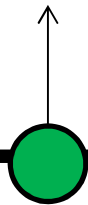

# UN NCD Review Modalities Resolution

## NCD Alliance's Six Priorities

- **A high-level review:** This will encourage participation of Heads of State/Government;
- **September 2014:** Held during the opening of the 69th session of the UN General Assembly;
- **Two days in length:** To provide adequate time for discussion and debate;
- **Establish a Civil Society Task Force:** To assist in preparations for an informal interactive civil society hearing ahead of the meeting, and maximise civil society input to the review itself;
- **Formal inclusion of civil society:** In the review itself and in all preparatory consultations;
- **Concise and action-oriented political declaration:** That reaffirms and builds on the 2011 Political Declaration to guide and monitor the NCD response beyond 2014.



## Next steps Global NCD Framework

- Coordinate advocacy towards UN GA discussion on UN SG report – Jan TBC
- Leverage WHO Executive Board (Jan 20-25) for:
  - A robust GCM
  - Support for comprehensive Review and Assessment 2014
  - NCDs in post-2015
- Mobilise network to support UN modalities resolution on NCD Review 2014

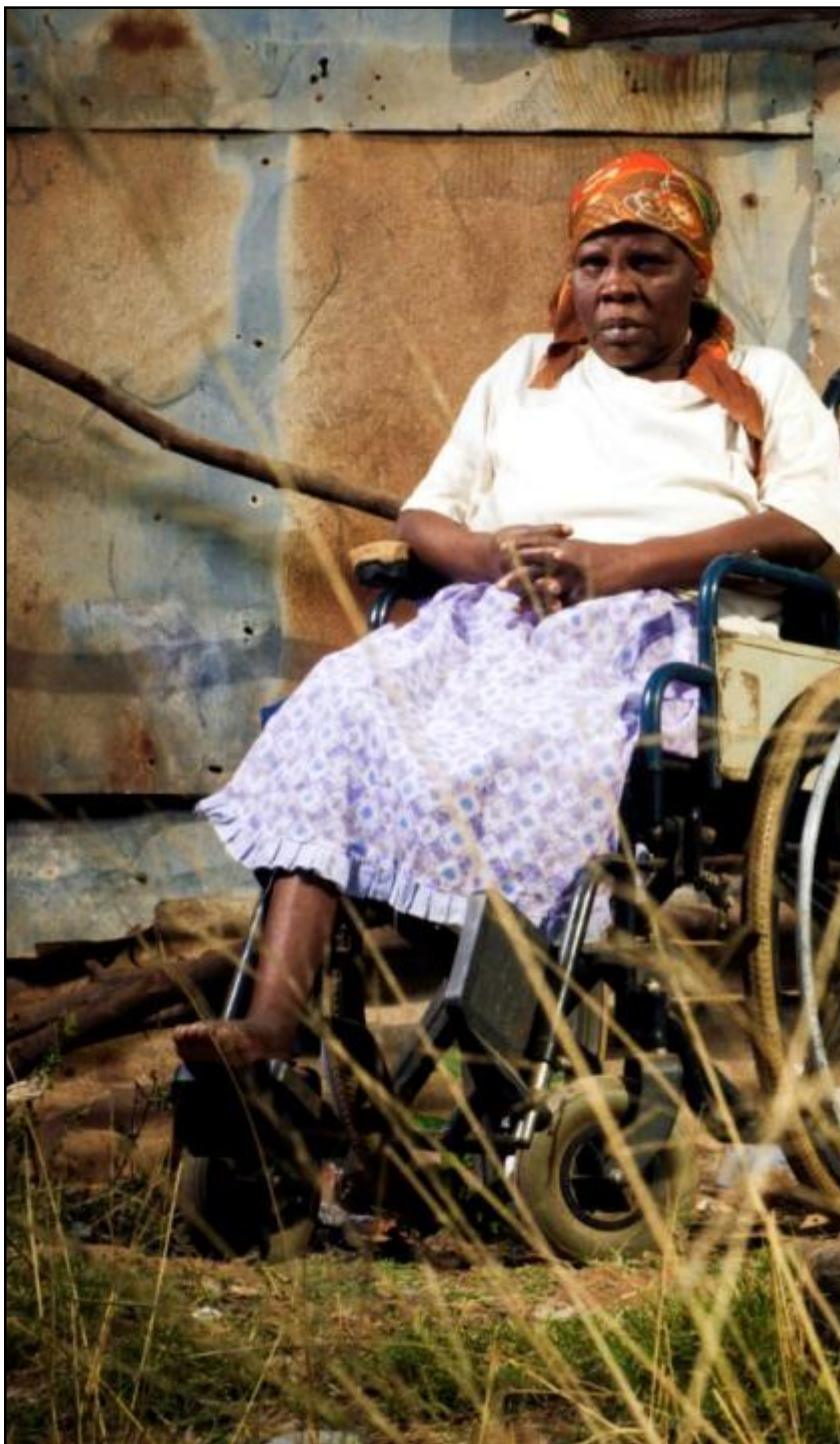

# The need - a global perspective



- 57 million deaths
- >1 million deaths/week
  - >800,000 unrelieved pain
- ~25 million need palliative care
- Families (at least 2 each)



## The problem of unrelieved pain

Globally,

**7.3 million**

people die of cancer or HIV each year in moderate or severe pain

More than

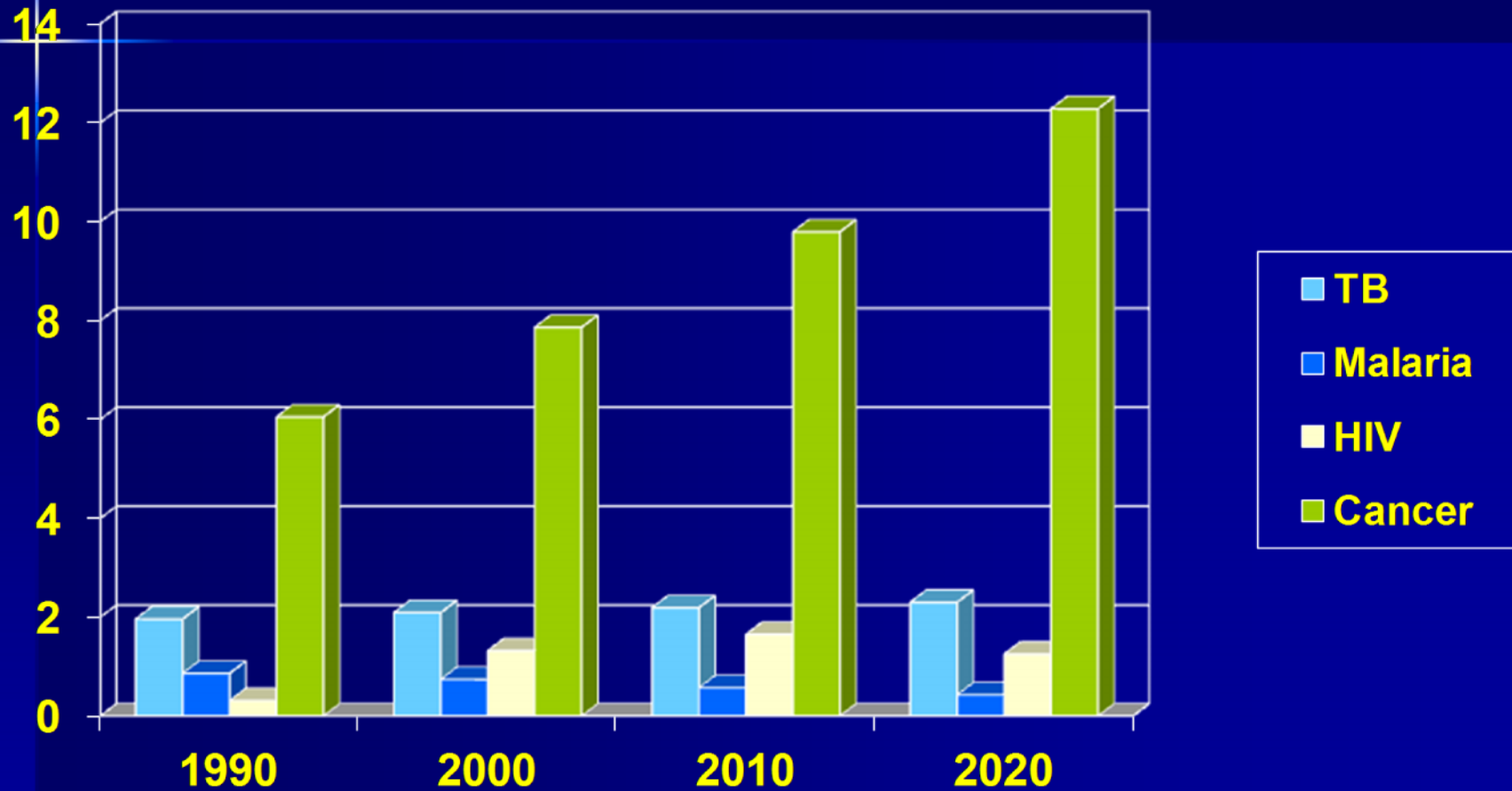
**2.9 million**

die without pain relief

**99.9%**

of these deaths are in low and middle-income countries

# Palliative care availability

- Worldwide Palliative Care Alliance study:
  - Palliative care was well integrated into health care systems in 20 countries worldwide.
  - Forty-two percent of countries have no palliative care service delivery at all
  - Almost a third of countries have only limited service delivery that reaches only a small percentage of the population.
- International Narcotics Control Board: 21 countries consumed “inadequate” and more than 100 countries consumed “very inadequate” levels of opioid analgesics.

# Uncontrolled Pain

# Palliative care advocacy

- Coalition of groups advocates for greater international attention for palliative care:
  - UN drug control bodies: Commission on Narcotic Drugs, UN Office on Drugs and Crime and International Narcotics Control Board
  - World Health Organization, Executive Board and Assembly

# Geneva advocacy

- Push for palliative care as part of NCD monitoring framework, action plan, etc.
- Push for EB and WHA to discuss palliative care as stand-alone item
- Side events at WHA in 2012 and 2013 -> core group of supporting countries (Panama, US, Uganda, Kenya, Malaysia)

# Progress on EB/WHA

- At EB in January 2013 Panama requested WHO to prepare report on palliative care for 2014. Draft report circulating at WHO.
- Core group led by Panama working on resolution draft. Other countries: Australia, Chile, Ghana, Libya, Malaysia, South Africa, Spain and US.

# Next steps

- Collect and collate comments and suggestions on draft resolution (once circulated)
- Encourage countries, esp. EB members, to co-sponsor the resolution
- Develop strategy for support promoting key amendments to draft
- Advocate for resolution at EB

- Member States discuss how to **adapt** and **tailor** global NCD framework;
- Opportunity for Member States to:
  - Comment on the **WHO Zero Draft Terms of Reference for the GCM for NCDs**
  - Provide feedback on position of health and **NCDs in the post-2015 development** framework

### NCDA Activity

- Coordinate NCDA representation
- Provide briefing with background information and key advocacy messages
- Deliver written/verbal statements for input into the discussions.



# WHO-WPRO RCM

## Agenda items:

- NCDs
- Ageing and Health

## WPRO Region Member States Resolution:

- Endorsed RAP for NCD
- **Systematic approach** to NCDs is critical
- **Facilitate action** on various risk factors for NCDs
- **Access to services** in primary care facilities
- **Strengthen and support** national NCD prevention and control programmes

## Regional Framework for Action on Ageing and Health in the Western Pacific

- **To guide policy and action** for the next 6 years
- **Four pillars of action** to address challenges include:
  - Foster **age-friendly environments** through action across sectors
  - Promote healthy ageing **across the life-course** and prevent functional decline and disease among older people



# WHO-EMRO RCM

## Agenda items:

- Follow-up to the Political Declaration on NCDs
- Progress Report on the Tobacco-Free Initiative

## Follow-up to the Political Declaration on NCDs

- Encouraged to **revise and update** national NCD plans
- Encouraged to initiate **multisectoral collaboration**
- **Strengthen NCD surveillance** focusing on national targets and indicators.

## Progress Report on the Tobacco-Free Initiative:

- Regional Office and FCA have conducted training workshops on assessing illicit tobacco trade
- Only 6 out of 23 countries are fully protected from exposure to the tobacco industry advertising



## WHO-EURO Ministerial Conference on NCDs, Ashgabat, Turkmenistan

### Three main themes:

- NCDs and development;
- A tobacco-free Europe;
- National responses to NCDs

### Ashgabat Declaration

- Work across the whole of government;
- Accelerate efforts towards a tobacco-free Europe;
- Take the necessary steps to improve the surveillance of NCDs;
- Ensure a balanced and equitable investment in public health;
- Adopt national NCD targets.

### NCD Activity

- Delivered a joint NGO statement on behalf of 8 international and European NCD NGOs. Recommended five areas to concentrate on, including:
  - Prioritising and investing in NCDs at the national level;
  - Encourage both a whole-of government and whole-of-society response to NCDs.

## National Consultative Meeting on NCDs in Ethiopia:

- Organized by MoH in partnership with Mathiwos Wondu- Ethiopia Cancer Society, National NCDA focal point
- **Objectives:**
  - Introducing national stakeholders to the UNPD on NCDs
  - Assessing Ethiopia's status in implementing the UNPD thus far and chart the way forward
- **Addis Ababa Communiqué on NCDs**
  - Emphasizes the high burden of NCDs on the national health system
  - Highlights the need to act together to prevent and control NCDs
  - Communiqué made available to the media

## NCD Japan Forum 2013 – The Role of Japan in International NCD control

- In cooperation between Health and Global Policy Institute (HGPI) and NCD Alliance Japan
- **Aims**
  - Assess NCD control in Japan
  - Discuss how Japan can contribute to NCD control globally

## Norwegian Cancer Society at European Development Days


- Lab session: **Improving cancer prevention**
- Describe international efforts for NCD prevention
- Address the rising challenge of cervical cancer in LMICs
- **Aims:**
  - Strategies to prevent cancer in LMICs
  - Identify EU role in **supporting cancer/NCD prevention** in the post-2015 era.

## Regional/National NCDA Listserv

- 4 regional NCD alliances and 22 national alliances
- **Forum:**
  - Share national/regional updates
  - Exchange information on progress and challenges faced
  - Share experiences in fundraising, capacity building etc.
- **Global NCD Alliance Role:**
  - Share regular updates on campaigns
  - Ensure national/regional NCD alliances are aligned and supportive of global campaigns

## NCD Alliance Program

### *“Strengthening Health Systems, Supporting NCD Action”*

- First NCD Alliance program to **support and build capacity of national NCD civil society**
  - **Two year programme** (2013-2014) – Brazil, South Africa and the Caribbean region
  - 3 National Implementing Partners: ***The Healthy Caribbean Coalition (HCC); Alliance for Control of Tobacco Use Brazil (ACT); South African NCD Alliance (SA NCDA)***
  - **Objectives:** To build the capacity of NCD civil society, to monitor national progress on NCDs and advocate for improved NCD policies and the strengthening of health systems

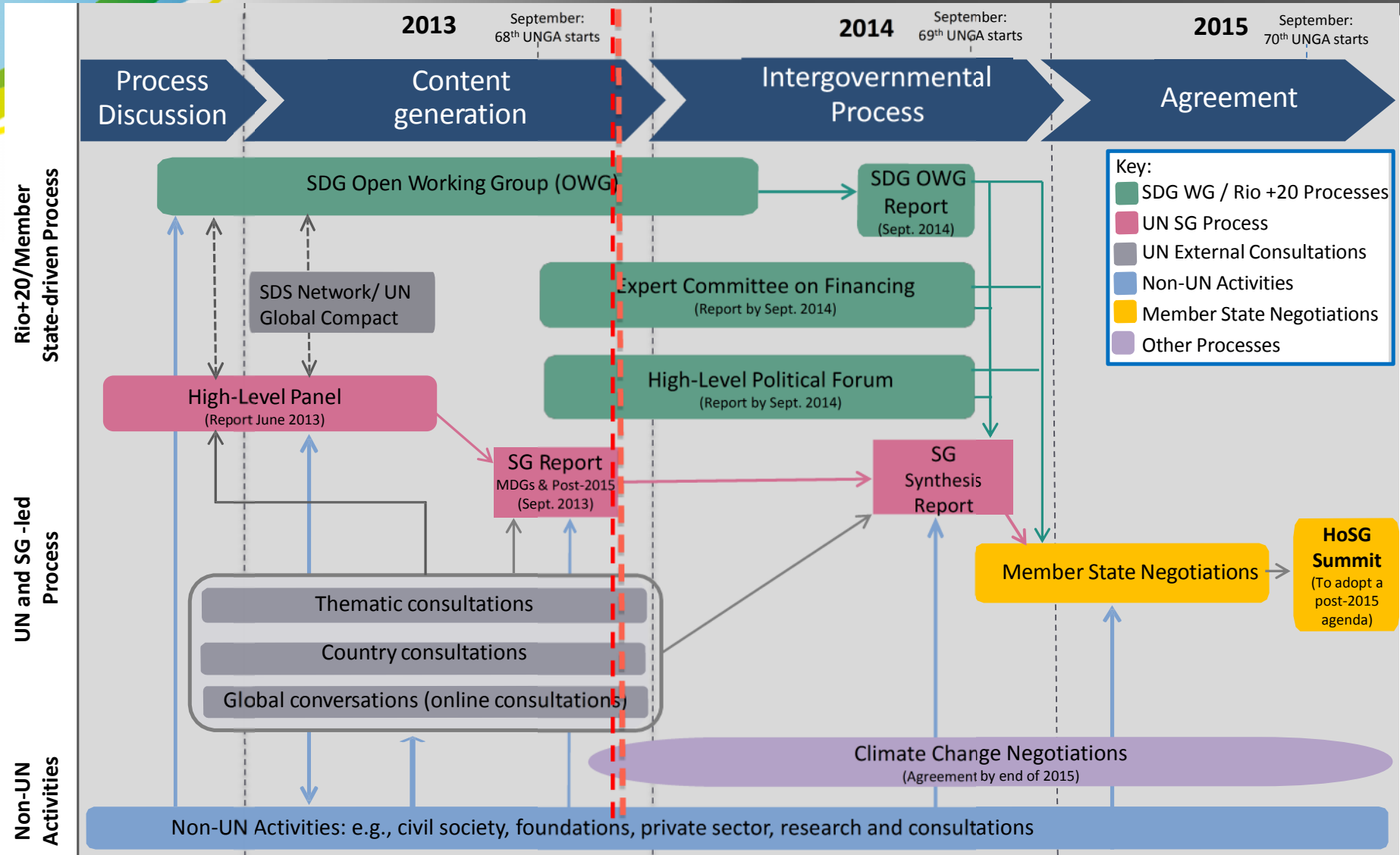

# NCD Alliance priorities for Post-2015



- **Universal, rights-based, equitable approaches**
- Health goal that **accommodates all priorities**, including NCDs
- **A standalone target on NCDs:**
  - Based on 25 by 25
- **Enablers:**
  - Universal health coverage and access
  - Social determinants of health
- Health indicators across **all dimensions of framework**

### Theme 1: Sustained economic growth

- Poverty as determinant of poor health outcomes
- Increased allocation of resources toward UHC+A
- Implement fiscal policies to increase domestic revenue, reduce NCD risk factor exposure
- Decent employment: Healthy workforce and workplaces
- Donors meet %0.7 ODA commitment

- Access to clean, affordable, sustainable energy, particularly in LMICs
- Measure health impacts of energy policies

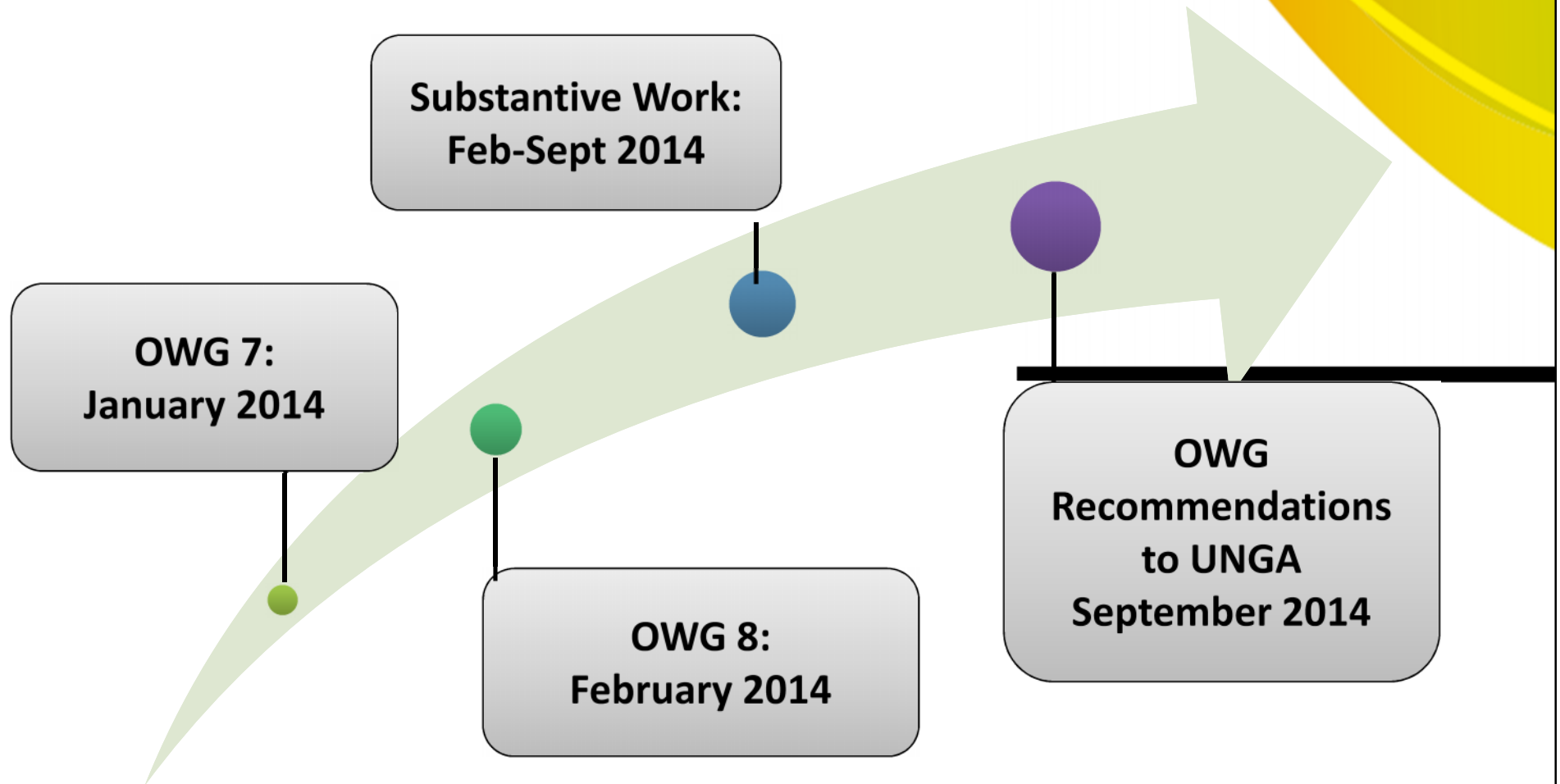

- **April 2014:** 1<sup>st</sup> High-Level Meeting of Global Partnership for Effective Development Cooperation - follow up from Busan
- **July 2014:** UN Development Cooperation Forum – global partnerships for post-2015
- **Nov 2014:** International Conference on Nutrition (ICN2)

## WHO/WB UHC Monitoring Framework

## Call to Action

- NCDA will continue to **engage** our network to further develop our post-2015 positions;
