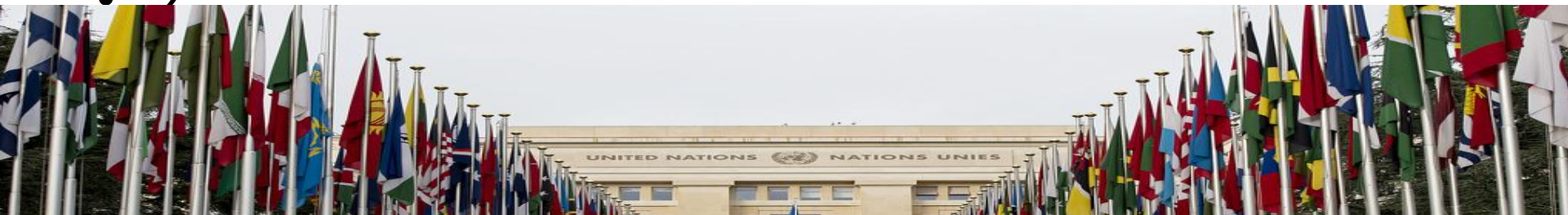

NCD Alliance Priorities Recap

- Encourage adoption of **Global Coordination Mechanism (GCM)** on NCDs and support an ambitious **work plan**
- Raise awareness and support for a successful **UN NCD Review 2014**
- Promote importance of health and NCDs in **post-2015 development**
- Support **Palliative Care resolution**

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67th WHA agenda item 13: NCDs



13.1 Prevention and Control of NCDs

- Total of **53 Member States interventions**
- MS congratulated WHO for delivering on global assignments from PD
- Key MS noted the **importance of multisectoral collaboration and action** in the global NCD response, and **meaningful involvement of CS** in the GCM
- Proposed **“friendly” amendments** on the GCM work plan, particularly on Appendix 1 on the appointment, composition and outputs of working groups

Decisions

1. Adopted the **action plan indicators for NCDs**;
2. Recommended **ToRs for UN Task Force on NCDs** for submission to ECOSOC;
3. Adopted the **ToRs for the GCM** and noted the **GCM work plan**;
4. Noted **UN Review paper**; request for the Director-General to report back on the Review to WHA 68 in 2015.

A GCM for NCDs – what now? NCD Alliance Priorities

- GCM ToRs fails to live up to vision of UNPD. Should be regarded as **first phase of the GCM** only

Moving forward:

- Ensure establishment of **roster of “NCD experts**; must be distinct from existing roster of WHO technical experts
- Call upon WHO / MS to clarify **NSAs participation in GCM** – neither ToRs nor work plan provide detail
- Inform set up of two **WGs** in September 2014
- **Leverage UN Review** to discuss further avenues for truly multisectoral partnerships for NCDs

- **13.2: Maternal, infant and young child nutrition:**
 - Decision endorses newborn health action plan;
 - Urges MS to strengthen national policies, mobilize human/financial resources to improve access and quality of care; improve data collection;
 - Requests DG to provide technical support to MS and report on progress on goals and targets periodically until 2030.
- **13.3: Global Disability Action Plan:**
 - Resolution endorses WHO Disability GAP 2014–2021;
 - Requests DG to report on progress to 70th and 74th WHA.
- **13.5: Psoriasis:**
 - Resolution encourages MS to raise awareness / advocate against stigma;
 - Requests DG to publish report on psoriasis by 2015.

Promoting Health through the Life course

- **14.1: Health in the post-2015 development agenda:**
 - Adopted a resolution urging Member States and WHO DG to ensure health central to post-2015 development agenda.
 - Calls on MS to incorporate need for action on NCDs and injuries, and promote mental health, as well as inclusion of health sensitive indicators in all relevant dimensions of sustainable development.
- **14.4: Life course approach to healthy ageing:**
 - Noted report and requested the WHO Director-General to develop a comprehensive global strategy and plan of action for healthy ageing to be considered by the 138th EB and 69th WHA in 2016.

- Resolution notes ongoing work on **Framework for Country Action for HiAP**
- Requests DG to prepare FCA for consideration by 68th WHA in consultation with all relevant stakeholders (incl. NGOs) and to report on progress of implementation of resolution to 69th WHA
- **Framework for Country Action for Health in All Policies:**
 - “Starter’s Kit” for applying Health in All Policies
 - Sets out 6 key components to put the HiAP approach into practice
 - Roles and responsibilities for gvts, health authorities, IGOs

Palliative Care



15.5: Palliative care

- Ground-breaking resolution adopted to drive national action to reduce barriers to the accessibility and availability of palliative care

Priorities for Civil Society moving forward:

1. Encourage core group of supporting MS to be champions for implementation in their respective regions
2. Develop manuscripts on each of the models of palliative care presented at the WHA side event
3. Dialogue with WHO cross-cluster working group on palliative care to identify priority actions and countries
4. Develop a library of existing materials and resources that can support implementation of resolution
5. Collate information on existing efforts in PC, building on existing WPCA mapping to avoid duplication

- **11.3: Engagement with Non-State Actors:**
Decision calls for further consultations at WHO Regional Committee Meetings in 2014; Member States are invited to submit “specific” follow-up questions to the Secretariat by **17th June**.
- WHO secretariat requested to provide an account of these “further consultations” and a proposed way forward to the 136th WHO Executive Board in January 2015.

Second International Conference on Nutrition (ICN2)

- **Create consensus on how to address major nutrition challenges** – including undernutrition, micronutrient deficiencies and overweight through national policies / effective international cooperation, especially by **ensuring food systems better address nutrition needs**
- Approve a **political declaration** and **framework for action** to ensure effective implementation of the commitments made at ICN2
- **FAO/WHO Joint Working Group** set up through WHO EB decision
- **FAO/WHO held 2 public consultations on draft PD so far**
- **Framework for Action** and format of **NSA engagement at ICN2** still unclear

ICN2 at WHA:

- Strong FAO presence: FAO Director-General da Silva addresses WHA:
 - Use ICN2 to “shine the spotlight on nutrition” and address undernourishment, micro-deficiencies and rising obesity rates
- FAO/WHO and JWG Co-Chairs luncheon with civil society discusses CS perspective on draft PD and CS engagement in process leading up to and during ICN2

NCD Alliance/WCRF Engagement and Next Steps

- Continue to advocate for **action-oriented** OD through advocacy with FAO/WHO JWG addressing **malnutrition in all its forms**
- Engage with broader group of CS orgs to influence process
- **Attend Informal Hearing of civil society for FAO Member States in Rome scheduled for 20 June**

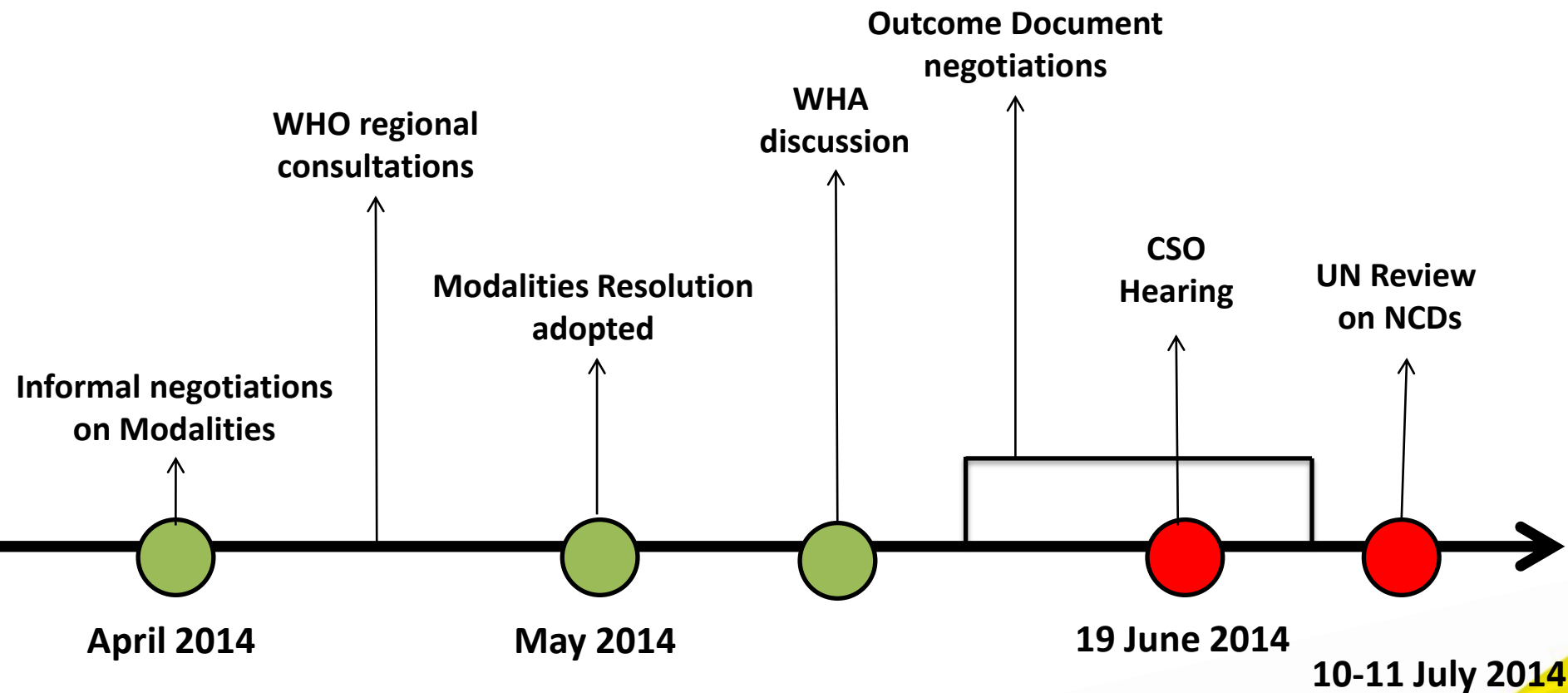

UN Civil Society Hearing on NCDs Overview

- **Date:** Thursday **19 June 2014** at UN HQ in New York
- **Theme:** *Global Progress, National Action: Moving from Commitment to Implementation*
- **Participation:** Civil society-led - NGOs, academia, private sector. Member States to observe.
- **Purpose:**
 - Reflect on progress made since 2011
 - Achievements, good practices, gaps in implementing the Political Declaration
 - Contribution made by NGOs / private sector
 - Means of civil society accountability
 - **Recommendations on outcomes for UN Review**

UN Civil Society Hearing on NCDs Format

- 10 am – 10:45 am: Opening plenary
- 10:45 am – 1 pm: Roundtable 1
 - *Enhancing international cooperation for NCDs: Mobilizing domestic, bilateral, regional, and multilateral **resources**, and **building capacities** for sustainable human development*
- 3 – 5:30 pm: Roundtable 2
 - *Mobilizing whole-of-society efforts for NCD prevention and control at national and regional levels: gaps, solutions, innovations and collaborative **multisectoral partnerships**, and fostering **private sector and non-health sector engagement***

Zero Draft Outcome Document

NCD Alliance Analysis and Key Points

- Build upon the **2011 UN Political Declaration on NCDs**, with similar sub-headings
- Address the “**unfinished business**” in the NCD response – gaps, challenges
- Reinforce NCDs as a **sustainable human development challenge**, inc recommendations on post-2015
- Commit to bold, new commitments for action at the **national level**
- Avoid mixing **technical and political** (paras 4 and 5)
- Ensure NCDs are discussed at future **UN General Assemblies**

- Reduce the global NCD resource gap through increased international and domestic funding
- OECD to integrate a purpose code on NCDs into CRS
- Increase provision of capacity building assistance for NGOs

Accountability

- WHO develop tool to measure contribution of civil society and private sector by 2015
- Commit to hold UN High-Level Review in 2017, and every four years thereafter

Summary of Discussions - Health

Increasing support for outcome-focused health goal

- **Co-chairs' proposal: “*Healthy life at all stages for all*”**

MS priorities for health:

- Unfinished **MDGs**
 - Addressing HIV/AIDS, malaria, TB, NTDs, other communicable diseases
 - Ending preventable maternal and child deaths
- **Strong support for target to reduce premature mortality from NCDs**
- Support for **UHC as standalone target**
 - Most delegations called for inclusion of financial risk protection
- Increased access to **affordable and essential medicine and vaccines**
- Sexual and reproductive health services (and rights, for some)
- Environmental determinants of health
- Narcotic drug and substance abuse

OWG 11

Summary of Discussions - NCDs

Strong support for standalone target, including prevention and reducing preventable deaths

Proposed be included:

- 25% by 2025 target (CARICOM)
- Mental health (and “wellbeing” for some)
- Road traffic injuries
 - Target: Reduce road traffic injuries and fatalities by 50% by 2030
- Address risk factors
 - Tobacco, (FCTC)
 - Physical activity
 - Healthy diets

- **Purpose:** Initial negotiations on new OWG “Zero Draft” and introduction text
- Now 17 focus areas (reducing inequalities added)
- Delegations expected to come with “concise and final language”

Zero Draft: Introduction text

“Poverty eradication is the greatest global challenge facing the world today”

- SDGs should be:
 - Action-oriented, universally-applicable
 - Accompanied by targets and measurable indicators
 - Account for different national circumstances, capacities, policies
 - Integrated, achieve sustainable development in all 3 dimensions
- Attention to vulnerable countries, strengthening international cooperation
- Strong on principle of **national ownership**
- **Reaffirms right to food, rule of law, gender equality...but no reference to health**



Goal 2: End hunger, achieve food security and adequate nutrition for all, and promote sustainable agriculture

- Nutrition now clearly separated from sustainable agriculture
- Target 2.2: “End malnutrition in all its forms, including undernutrition, micronutrient deficiencies, and obesity and overweight, with special attention to reducing stunting by 40% and wasting to less than 5% in children <5y by 2025, w/ focus on needs of pregnant and lactating women”

NCD Alliance analysis:

- ✓ **Support “malnutrition in all its forms”**
- X **More ambitious and measurable targets, specifically in regards to overweight**
- X **Means of implementation for Goal 2 lacking**



Goal 3: *Attain healthy life for all at all ages*

- Addressing **unfinished MDGs**
 - Reduce maternal mortality rate
 - End preventable newborn, infant, under-five deaths
 - End HIV/AIDS, TB, malaria, NTDs
- Reduce **premature deaths from NCDs**, injuries, promote mental health and wellbeing, and strengthen prevention/treatment of narcotic drug and substance abuse
- Increase **healthy life expectancy** for all by x%
- Achieve **UHC**, including financial risk protection
- Universal availability and access to safe, effective and quality **affordable essential medicines, vaccines, medical technologies**
- Universal access to **sexual and reproductive health**
- Decrease number of deaths and illnesses from **indoor/outdoor pollution**

Zero Draft: NCDs

Target 3.4 on NCDs:

- Reduce by x% premature deaths from non-communicable diseases (NCDs)
- Reduce deaths from injuries, including halving road traffic deaths
- Promote mental health and wellbeing
- Strengthen prevention and treatment of narcotic drug and substance abuse

Proposed means of implementation (17.10-17.14)

- Strengthen implementation of FCTC
- Access to affordable meds through TRIPS flexibilities
- Increase recruitment, training, retention of health workforce

Zero Draft – NCD Alliance Analysis

Goal 3:

- Amend goal to ***“Maximize healthy lives at all ages for all”***

Target 3.4:

- Support standalone NCD targets based on “25 by 25” target, but amend to read ***“at least 30% reduction of premature deaths”***
- Support inclusion of mental health target, but amend to ***“mental and neurological disorders”***
- Separate narcotic drug and substance abuse into standalone target
- Support UHC as target with financial risk protection and health security
- Support target on indoor and outdoor air pollution

Add:

- Stronger means of implementation (financing for health, NCDs)
- Health and NCD-sensitive indicators in other dimensions/goals

Health in the post-2015 development agenda

The Sixty-seventh World Health Assembly,

Having considered the report on monitoring the achievement of the health-related Millennium Development Goals: Health in the post-2015 development agenda;¹

Reaffirming the Constitution of the World Health Organization, which states that the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of health is one of the fundamental rights of every human being without distinction of race, religion, political belief, economic or social conditions;

Reaffirming also the principles of the United Nations Millennium Declaration adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in resolution 55/2, including human dignity, equality and equity, and recognizing the need for their reflection in the post-2015 development agenda;

Recalling the United Nations General Assembly's resolution 66/285 "The future we want", in which it recognizes that health is a precondition for and an outcome and indicator of all dimensions of sustainable development;

Stressing also that concerns related to health equity and rights should be addressed in efforts to achieve the Millennium Development Goals;

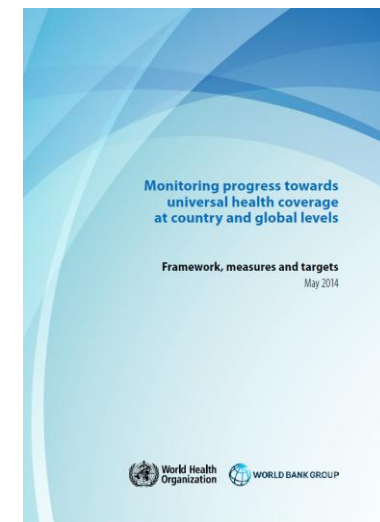
Recalling resolution WHA66.11 on health in the post-2015 development agenda, which urged Member States to ensure that health is central to the post-2015 development agenda;

Reaffirming the need to sustain current achievements and intensify efforts in those countries where accelerated progress is needed towards achievement of the health-related Millennium Development Goals, especially maternal, newborn and child health;

Concerned also of the burden of maternal, newborn and child morbidity and mortality, communicable diseases, including HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria and neglected tropical diseases, emerging diseases and the rising burden of noncommunicable diseases and injuries;

Acknowledging that universal health coverage implies that all people have access without discrimination to personally determined sets of the needed promotive, preventive, curative, palliative and rehabilitative essential health services and essential, reliable, effective and quality medicines, while ensuring that the use of these services does not expose the users to financial hardship with a special emphasis on the poor, vulnerable and marginalized segments of the population;

Universal Health Coverage (UHC) WHO/WB Monitoring Framework

Box 1. Goal, targets and illustrative indicators of UHC

Goal

Achieve UHC. All people obtain the good-quality essential health services that they need without enduring financial hardship.

Targets

- By 2030, all populations, independent of household income, expenditure or wealth, place of residence or gender, have at least 80% essential health services coverage.
- By 2030, everyone has 100% financial protection from out-of-pocket payments for health services.

- **Prevention indicators:** Satisfaction of family planning needs, at least four antenatal care visits, measles vaccination improved water source, adequate sanitation and non-use of tobacco.
- **Treatment indicators:** Skilled birth attendance, antiretroviral therapy, tuberculosis case detection and treatment success (combined into a single indicator), hypertension treatment and diabetes treatment.
- **Key points in UHC framework**
 - The monitoring framework outlined in the paper can be used to translate the goal of UHC into measures of progress that are valid and comparable among countries.
 - Each country is expected to add further measures of service coverage and further equity stratifiers in order to tailor UHC monitoring to its context.
 - UHC monitoring is not a substitute for other measures of health systems performance, such as improved health status or health worker density and distribution.

Universal Health Coverage (UHC) NCD Alliance Activities
